Our DVD recording, remastered from a 1981 performance, features the incomparable Shirley Verret and Placido Domingo in the title roles, with Julius Rudel and the San Fransisco Opera Chorus and Orchestra. This recording remains the standard by which the few available video recordings of *Samson* are measured. The dramatic and musical values are a delight.
