Chénier. The opera was first produced in 1896 and presents the story of a famous French poet who was executed in 1794 during the French Revolution. It is both a love story and a dramatization of the intrigues and dangers to the intelligentsia during the revolutionary 1790s. Giordano's other operas are rarely played, but this one has been much favored, partly due to the wonderful lyric-dramatic music provided for the title character.

Our DVD recording, from a 1996 performance, features Placido Domingo in the title role, with Maria Gulighina and Juan Pons as Maddalena and Gérard. Domingo and Gulighina are extraordinary in the roles, in this exceptional verismo opera. James Levine conducts.
